Professor Lombardo will conduct a mock crime scene investigation. During this session, students will learn how to fingerprint suspects and how to lift fingerprints off objects found at a crime scene. There will also be a discussion explaining the different roles that are needed during a crime scene investigation based on the majors we offer here at Indiana Tech: criminal justice, forensic science and pre-law.

Drop in at any time during this session to join in the BIO 1360 Laboratory. Students are spending this semester in antibiotic discovery. Taking soil from the Indiana Tech campus, you will see them isolate bacterial strains, test for sensitivity against resistant bacteria, classify and identify the new isolates, sequence the genome to confirm identification and purify antibiotic compounds. Grab a lab coat, put on gloves and experience molecular bacteriology in person. This laboratory is done in partnership with other labs across the world, as coordinated by the Small World Initiative.
